A Family Literacy Game

Subject-Verb-Noun

After being provided the tools and training, grant caregivers are able to teach their children lessons on subjects, verbs, and nouns. This spin-off family game was derived from a presentation about Social-Emotional Engagement: Knowledge and Skills (SEE-KS) during the Governor's Third Annual Summit on Early Language and Literacy.



The game includes family photos, photos of other children participating in the grant, verbs based on the five senses, and picture cards. In the picture on the left, Tania creates the sentence, “Braydon sees a penny.” Parents were also taught how to ask questions to encourage critical thinking. In the picture on the right, they have “Kirah tastes _____.” Tania’s mom asks “Would it be *cake* or *waking up*?”

This is a quick and simple game; however, it is laying a strong foundation for a lifetime of reading, writing, and comprehension.
