As Director of the Get Georgia Reading Campaign, I am honored to write a letter of support on the Twiggs Vitamins R (Reading) and L (Literacy). This is a unique pilot project that addresses language nutrition in one of our rural counties. Language nutrition is the use of language that is sufficiently rich in engagement, quality, quantity, and contact that it nourishes the child neurologically, socially, and linguistically. This initiative works with parents monthly to teach techniques for encouraging reading and promoting literacy among 2- and 3-year-olds. They have aligned developmental and academic standards to provide continuity of learning experiences and personal growth in parents as well as our young learners. This community collaborative is creatively designed to include the local elementary school, community health center, health department, public library and major local employer.
